New Beginnings: Spring and Summer 2023




Gamma Delta Update

She also performed in a modern piece choreographed by Liz Cozad-Howard, the director of the dance program at Ohio Northern. The show consisted of 10 dances and a cast of around 35 dancers, as well as 5 student choreographers. Jackie had the opportunity to choreograph a contemporary duet starring her two younger sisters, Madeline and Isabelle. Jackie states, "I am so proud of their hard work and how it turned out! Overall it was an amazing show and I learned so much about the technical process by being involved as a choreographer as well as a dancer!" Congratulations to Jackie, Maggie, and everyone involved in such a successful show! Additionally, nine of our brothers were accepted into Ohio Northern's Chapter of Mortar Board, a national honor society that recognizes college seniors for their scholarship, leadership, and service.
